1. The following report of Communist activities on CHEJU-DO is furnished for your information.

a. The Communist, using areas formerly fortified by the Japanese, are continuing their guerrilla activities against government officials and the South Korean Government itself, which they consider a detriment to the establishment of a unified government. Money to support these operations is obtained from smuggling activities, each shipload averaging 250,000 won.

b. Ships from CHEJU-DO, engaged in smuggling make approximately five round trips to Japanese waters per month. (C-6)

On 03 and 06 August 1948, this office submitted three G-2 Estimates of Guerrilla Situations (with situation maps) pertaining to the provinces of Kyonggi Do, Chungcheong Pukto, Chungcheong Namdo, and Cholla Namdo-Cholla Pukto-Kyongsang Namdo to General Dean. It is understood that these were then turned over to the Advisor, National Police, for appropriate action.

Since that time, this office has endeavored to establish effective liaison and coordination of activities with the American Advisors concerning the communist-inspired guerrilla activities but negligible information has been received. Except for a brief, inconclusive oral report by Mr. Harman, Advisor to the Uniform Bureau, no other information has been received to date.

As the Command is extremely interested in elimination or curtailment of communist activities, it is requested that this office be furnished a summary of police action during the interim period, including comments relative to the guerrilla situation in the aforementioned areas, and clarifying the results of police action.

1. The "History of the Department of Internal Security" submitted by that Department in conformity with letters this Headquarters, Subject: "Preparation of History of Military Government", dated 3 July and 11 August 1948, omits reference to and discussion of the operations conducted in Cheju-do by the Korean Constabulary under the Department of Internal Security.

2. It is essential that the Cheju-do operation be fully covered in the official Department of the Army History of the Military Government and Occupation of Korea.

3. It is directed, therefore, that you prepare and submit to G-2 this Headquarters, (Attn: Historical Section) a comprehensive, fully documented history of the Cheju-do operation, utilizing materials available in the files of the former Department of Internal Security, consequential personal observations of personnel involved, and such other information as may be available.

4. Form and method of footnoting should be in conformity with that prescribed in letters this Headquarters cited in paragraph 1, above (copies of which are enclosed).

5. The completed History should be given such classification as you deem appropriate, and submitted in two bound copies on or before 06 November 1948.
